## Publication Change for The Grapevine

In the early 1960s visionaries at places like MIT and UCLA began work on a global network of computers for use by government and universities. Their efforts led in 1992 to the first commercial online service of what is now the internet. The internet's impact is overwhelming, especially on communications media.

Print communications will not disappear totally, but they are changing because of the internet. For the Cathedral, it has become sensible to change the frequency and content of *The Grapevine*. ## Social Media Sunday on September 24

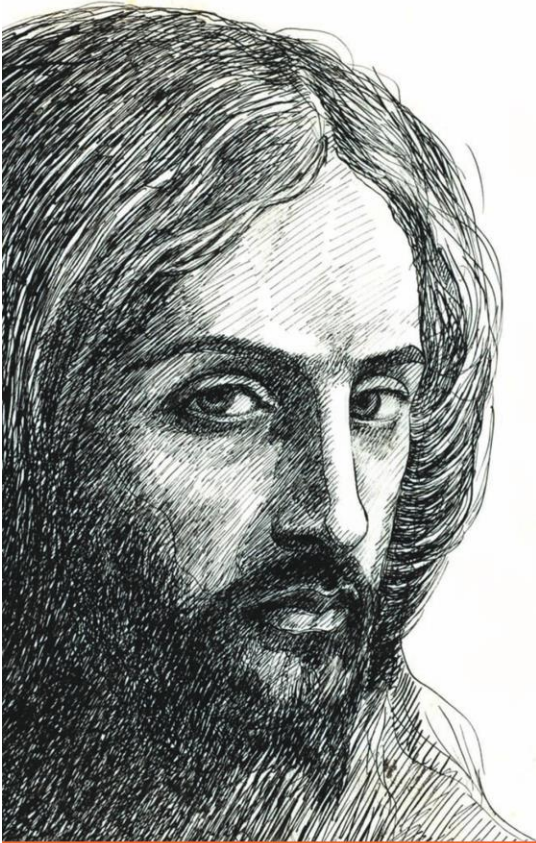

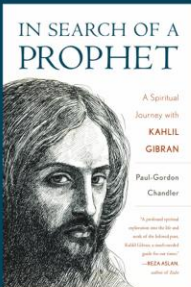
