40-Day River of Life Pilgrimage

On May 31, an extraordinary river journey began in northern New Hampshire, one mile from the Canadian border, and finished in Connecticut in Long Island Sound on July 8. It was a 40-day pilgrimage on the Connecticut River—the “River of Life”—organized by the Episcopal churches of New England in order to deepen their faith, connect with others, spread peace, and highlight the importance of preserving nature. The Connecticut River flows through four of the six New England states, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts and Connecticut. Paddlers who took part on the trip were of different religious backgrounds and from various northeastern states.



The pilgrimage reached Hartford on July 4. Members of five Episcopal churches in Hartford—Christ Church Cathedral, Church of the Good Shepherd, St. Monica’s, Grace, and Trinity—came together at Church of the Good Shepherd for a festival that included the Holy Eucharist, a multicultural feast, dancing and fellowship. Tours of the historic Church of the Good Shepherd on Wyllys Street that was built by Elizabeth Colt, widow of the world-famous manufacturer of arms, Samuel Colt, were offered. At the Eucharist names of victims of gun violence in the past three years were read and displayed on crosses outside the church.

The pilgrimage concluded on July 8 at the Dauntless Club in Essex, Connecticut, 400 miles south of its beginning. A ceremonial “merging of the river’s waters” was held.

The Bishop of the Episcopal Church in Connecticut, the Rt. Rev. Ian Douglas, was among the paddlers on the river. In an article in the *Hartford Courant* he described the sights of the river that included bald eagles and blue herons as “incredible.” He noted that the journey was inward just as much as it was down the river, and that “we need to learn to live with and alongside creation and not just see creation as something we can use.”
